## MARVELous May

ACTEM has partnered with the Maine State Library to provide this contest, a scavenger hunt project to increase students' awareness of MARVEL!, Maine's Virtual Library. MARVEL! contains thousands of magazines, newspapers and reference books and is available anywhere in Maine.

There are three options for high school student participation. In each category, there are a minimum of seven questions that need to be answered in order to compete for this year's grand prize: a digital whiteboard to be installed in the winning teacher's room, or other appropriate instructional location (value up to \$4500).



### **STEM: Science, Technology, Engineering and Math**

Topics include cloning, astronomy and geology. For some questions, it is important to use the new Windows on Maine database.

### **Humanities: Literature, History and Art**

This category includes questions about cuneiform, Zeus, Fauvism and R. B. Hall.

### **Wellness, Physical Education and Health**

Subject areas include interval training, the food pyramid and obesity.

### **Submitting Answers & Prizes**

All entries must be submitted online using Google Docs. For each question answered, make sure to also include the database that was used to find the answer. High school students must also correctly cite the source of their answer.

Entries must be submitted via the online form before 12:01AM EST on June 1, 2011.

Winners will be notified in early June.
