## Online Resources: EasyBib

The library is pleased to announce that we are now using EasyBib, "the automatic bibliography & citation maker," as the resource to create works cited documents for academic research. Gone are the days of printing off multi-page stylesheets and trying to decipher the ins and outs of MLA.



MLA's 7<sup>th</sup> edition is supported and creating citations from a variety of sources, from books to web sites to really obscure materials such as paintings and raw data are made remarkably easy.

A terrific new feature that EasyBib uses is called Autocite where users can cite books with just an ISBN number, and web sites with just a URL.

Citations created through EasyBib can be downloaded as a Microsoft Word compatible RTF document, emailed or printed with ease directly from their web site. For those that like to tweet, bibliographies can be shared through Twitter.

The library is providing not only a link directly to EasyBib on our site, but also a link to a template for MLA citations that provides a terrific overview of different types of material citations.
